## CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE FOR ANDRAGOGICAL AND PEDAGOGICAL SCIENCES (CEAPS)

SGT University is committed to becoming a globally recognised institution by aligning with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, emphasising student-centric learning and multidisciplinary approaches. To meet these goals, SGT University established the Centre of Excellence for Andragogical and Pedagogical Sciences (CEAPS) to drive pedagogical innovation and faculty upskilling.



The Centre conducts various faculty development programs with national and international experts, focusing on student-centred pedagogies like experiential learning, pedagogy, problem-based learning, and case-based learning. Since October 2022, approximately 40 activities have been conducted, training about 700 faculty members in areas including outcome-based education, pedagogic effectiveness, and applications of generative AI.

Collaborations: CEAPS has partnered with Skills and Education Group, UK, implementing a 3-month Professional Development Program on Innovations in Teaching and Learning. Select faculty members visited UK universities to study best practices, which were then incorporated into training modules for university-wide dissemination. Additional collaborations include programs with NPTC Group of Colleges, Universiti Teknologi Malaysia, Guru Angad Dev Teaching and Learning Centre, and ICT Academy.

### CCSP

The Thanu Padmanabhan Centre for Cosmology and Science Popularisation (CCSP) is intended to conduct research in cosmology and popularise science at the grassroots level. It comprehensively aims to produce well-rounded intellectuals and groom excellence as rational thinking in society, substantiated through multi-dimensional and multi-directional major components like:



- Excellent research in cosmology and particle physics.
- Popularisation of science for the common masses.

The centre has strong research foundations in cosmology, astrophysics, particle physics, and allied areas. Faculties have collaborations with notable national and international institutions like ISRO; IUCAA; Chinese Academy of Sciences; Eurasian National University, Kazakhstan; Omeg Institute, South Korea; International Collider Experiments, Jagiellonian University, Poland. Most of the faculties are affiliated with the Indian Academy of Sciences. CCSP develops scientific temperament through a mobile planetarium of specialised audio-visual equipment, projecting 360-degree immersive experiences inside a planetarium.

## NATIONAL REFERENCE SIMULATION CENTRE

The National Reference Simulation Centre (NRSC), established in 2018, is a tetrapartite collaboration of the Indian Nursing Council (INC), the John Hopkins Program for International Education in Gynecology and Obstetrics (JHPIEGO), funded by USAID, Laerdal Medical India, a Norway-based company and Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University (SGTU), Gurugram, in a 14000 sq. ft. area. It is one of Asia's earliest referral centres designed to cover medical and nursing inter-professional education and deliver in-service training programs using simulation-based learning.



The centre has high fidelity, medium fidelity and low fidelity manikins of significant degrees of realism that help in the artificial representation of a real-world process. Students are exposed to being competent and confident enough to encounter actual patients in any emergency. The centre focuses on adult learning with experiential and reflective learning in a psychologically safe container.



## ADVANCED STUDY INSTITUTE OF ASIA (ASIA)

The Advanced Study Institute of Asia (ASIA), established in 2023 and affiliated with Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University in Gurugram, India, serves as an interdisciplinary research center dedicated to enhancing the understanding of Asia, particularly South and Southeast Asia. Situated in New Delhi, ASIA aims to navigate the complexities of various fields, including International Relations, health, law, and societal issues, by leveraging the expertise of leading scholars and practitioners. The university library is a shrine of knowledge at SGT University. It has a large collection of the most recent books, online journals, national and international publications, and other learning resources in both print and electronic formats. The air-conditioned library has been professionally designed, with plenty of space and natural lighting for the comfort of readers, and can accommodate more than 1000 readers at once. It has more than 85000 volumes on its premises.

The digital library contains various media on a wide range of subjects, including medical sciences, dental sciences, allied health sciences, management, engineering, computer sciences, and so on. Aside from that, the library subscribes to over 35000 online e-journals and 1,59,000+ e-books, both of which can be accessed around the clock.

The library offers 24/7 remote access to digital resources via the mLibrary mobile app service and the digital library platform on [sgtuniversity.knimbus.com](http://sgtuniversity.knimbus.com). Users can also check all library resources and personal information remotely via the library OPAC service.

All of the library's operations, including classification and cataloguing, check-in and check-out, information services, and book barcoding, have been completely automated. Teachers and students can freely access over 100 nodes in the attached internet lab to browse the internet.

### Overview

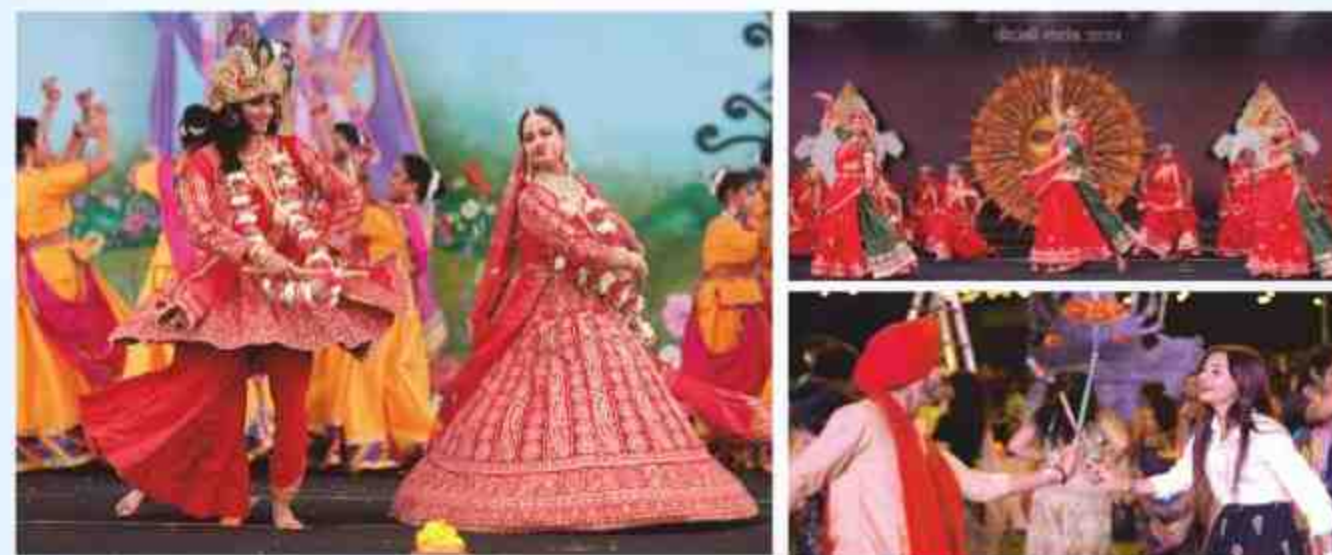

## HOW TO APPLY

1. The candidate must go through the information brochure carefully and familiarise themselves with the eligibility criteria for admission and other requirements before filling out the application form.
2. The application form should be filled out in English only.
3. The candidate should fill out the application form in his or her own handwriting, neatly and legibly.
4. Overwriting, cutting, or erasing in the application form should be avoided. It is advisable to first fill out a photocopy of the form and then the main application form.
5. A correct and complete address should be filled in the application form, failing which the responsibility for going stray from communication or any other implication shall lie with the candidate.
6. The candidate should write his or her father's and mother's name against the relevant columns in the form, as given in the DMC and the degree of the qualifying examination for admission.
7. The candidate should enter the date, month, and year of birth as recorded in the secondary school certificate or its equivalent certificate.
8. The candidate should affix a recent high-contrast photograph, preferably on a white background, in the space earmarked for it on the application form, wherever required. Photographs with a cap, hat, or dark spectacles are not permitted. Affix the photographs firmly with adhesive; they should not be pinned or stapled.
9. Requests for changes in particulars in the application form shall not be entertained under any circumstances.
10. Incomplete applications will not be entertained for processing.
11. The application form must be accompanied by all self-attested essential certificates.
12. The enclosures should be firmly tied or stapled to the application form.

### MODE OF FEE PAYMENT

1. Fees may be paid by demand draft, through ERP (student log-in), or any other mode approved by the university from time to time. The demand draft is to be drawn in favour of "Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University," payable at "Gurugram."
2. A candidate who is offered provisional admission by the Admission Cell/Counselors shall submit the Application Form duly completed in all respects to the Registration Branch and shall deposit the course fee with the Finance Branch (Collection Counter) so that registration formalities can be completed.
3. Students must obtain the receipt for every payment made to the university and deposit one copy in the respective student section.
4. Fees shall not be accepted in part or in installments unless specifically allowed by the competent authority of the University.
5. Delayed payments will attract late fee charges as prescribed by the university from time to time.
6. A student opting to withdraw his or her admission will be entitled to a refund of the fee as per the university norms.
7. The last date for admission in any program will be as notified by the regulatory councils, i.e., AICTE, UGC, NDC, NMC, PCI, BCI, INC, RCI, NCISM, etc., or as notified by the university.
8. Refundable caution money submitted at the time of admission will be refunded within 6 months from the date of declaration of the result or from the date of withdrawal from the course on the production of a NO DUES CERTIFICATE PRESCRIBED BY THE UNIVERSITY along with the original identity card.

### FEE STRUCTURE REVISION

The university reserves the right to decide the fee structure and review the same as per the provisions of the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006, as amended from time to time, which mandates that the university shall be self-financed and shall not be entitled to receive any grant or financial assistance from the government or any board or corporation owned or controlled by the Government. However, the fee structure so approved by the university will be notified. Hostel and transport charges will be increased by 8% (eight per cent) every year.

### SCHOLARSHIPS/FEE CONCESSIONS

1. The University awards scholarship in the form of tuition fee concessions to bonafide meritorious students as per the University's Scholarship Policy or fee concessions as per the provisions of the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006, as amended from time to time.
2. The interested and eligible candidates shall submit their application in the prescribed form on or before the last date notified each year by the University at the commencement of the academic session.
3. The candidates may be called for interaction by the Committee constituted for the purpose.

### GENERAL RULES

1. No candidate shall be admitted to the course to which he/she is seeking admission unless he/she fulfills the eligibility conditions. Admission will be purely provisional subject to verification of the candidate's eligibility by the University as per laid down rules and regulations. In case, a candidate is found ineligible at a later stage, the provisional admission will be cancelled and the candidate will have no right for admission to the course or a refund of fee paid by him/her.
2. No candidate shall be admitted to any university examination unless he/she has been enrolled/registered as a student of the University. This condition may be relaxed in respect of students or scholars studying Under the University's student exchange programme with any other University/deemed to be a University/autonomous institution.
3. A candidate from other University shall be eligible for admission to this University only on the submission of Migration Certificate. However, the condition of producing a Migration Certificate will not apply in case of students passing the equivalent examination from a foreign University recognized by UGC/NMC/DCI any other Indian regulatory body. These candidates shall submit any such equivalent certificates as provided/issued by their University.
4. In cases of real hardship, a student may be admitted provisionally at his/her own risk and responsibility subject to the condition that he/she shall submit his/her Migration Certificate to the University upto 31st December of the admission year.
5. If a candidate fails to submit the Migration Certificate until 31st December of the admission year, he/she will not be allowed to appear in the Annual Examination. However, in a sheer hard case, the Vice-Chancellor may allow a Candidate to appear in the examination provisionally on payment of a prescribed late fee and on submission of an affidavit from the First Class Magistrate to the effect that he/she is not appearing in any examination conducted by other University/Board simultaneously. If such a candidate fails to submit his/her migration certificate before the declaration of the result, his/her result shall be withheld. However, in hard and deserving case, the Vice-Chancellor may allow the declaration of result on submission of the migration certificate with a prescribed late fee within one year and with a prescribed late fee during the next two years of the declaration of the main result.
6. After admission the student shall pay to the University, through the University department/faculty which he/she joins, University enrolment-cum-eligibility fee and the continuation fee. In case of re-admission of a student whose name has been struck off from the rolls of the Department/Faculty, he/she shall pay the prescribed fee for making the necessary entries in the University register. However, no further fee for registration will be charged.
7. On registration, the student shall be issued the registration card by the Registration Branch through the respective HOD/Dean of Faculty in case of regular students, indicating the number under which his/her name has been entered in the register and that registration number shall be quoted in all correspondence with the University. In case of loss/misplacement, a duplicate copy of the registration card can be obtained by the student by making an application to this effect along with the prescribed fee.
8. Application for correction in the particulars of a student shall be entertained by the Registration Branch within 30 days from the date of registration without any fee. Applications received after this period shall be entertained only with the prescribed late fee.
9. Reservation policy shall be as per prevailing rules/Acts of the state of Haryana.
10. If a student remains absent from classes for a continuous period of seven working days without any valid reason, medical or otherwise, his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls of the university department / constituent college concerned irrespective of the fact that he/she has paid his/her dues in part or full. However, the student may be re-admitted with the permission of the Dean of the Faculty concerned on the recommendation of Head of the Department on payment of such fee as prescribed for the purpose from time to time in addition to arrears of fee, if any; provided that the Head of the Department concerned is satisfied that if re-admitted, the student will not fall short of requisite percentage of attendance/lectures, etc.
11. Each candidate shall submit the following Affidavits/Declaration-cum-Undertaking in the format given in the Information Brochure:
  - i. Anti-Ragging undertaking by the student.
  - ii. Anti-Ragging undertaking by the parent/guardian.
  - iii. Declaration-cum-Undertaking (Agreement Bond) by the parent/guardian/student.

## IMPORTANT HOSTEL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The students admitted to the hostel are assumed to be prudent persons, having sufficient maturity to live in an adult environment. Such living involves full respect for the rights of others, regard for self-discipline, high standard of honesty, and enviable moral conduct. These regulations have been framed not to restrict the conduct of individuals but to ensure that a multitude of students should live and work harmoniously together with minimum discord.

1. Hostel residence is optional for all categories of students.
2. Hostel Fee:
  - a) First year Student will apply and get the hostel room allotment from the warden and after the room allotment he/she will deposit the hostel fees with the accounts department. On receipt of the fees, room allotment will be confirmed.
  - b) Second year onwards, all the students staying in the hostel will get the re-allotment from the respective warden on the request for continuation by the students.
  - c) For MD, MS, MDS, MBBS, BDS and BAMS (Annual) Programmes, hostel allotment will be done on annual basis and from start of the academic session as per council norms and fees will be deposited for the full year in one instalment.
  - d) Hostel fees for all Programmes will be collected for full year in advance. Student shall not be permitted to leave the hostel in mid of the session.
  - e) If any student occupies the hostel in the month of August, he/she has to pay the full year fees, and if, he or she occupies the hostel from September onwards, pro-rata hostel fees will be collected up to next year July.
  - f) If the payment is not deposited in time, as specified by the accounts, a fine will be imposed at Rs. 500/- per day up to one month, if hostel fees is delayed by more than one month, then management has the right to get the room vacated.
3. Partial Hostel fee will not be accepted by the University.
4. Once paid, the hostel fee will neither be refunded nor transferred.
5. On completion of the course, those who join the Internship shall shift immediately to the hostel, marked specially for Interns without any fail.
6. All the hostellers who proceed for vacation or outside the University shall deposit the key of their room with the respective Hostel Warden.
7. Hostel accommodation (if available) will be provided to the students for a period equal to the duration of the concerned course. However, if a student fails in the year-end examination (two semesters) and, hence, is not promoted to the next higher classes as per the provisions of the course ordinance, he/she shall not be allowed to stay in the hostel.
8. Up-gradation of hostel room is allowed if available and permitted, subject to clearance of difference of charges. Furthermore, this facility can only be availed once in each academic year with the approval of hostel administration.
9. Students seeking admission to the hostel shall apply through ERP (student Login) immediately on confirmation of admission to the 1st year/1st semester of the course. A copy of latest medical certificate should be submitted to the respective hostel warden.
10. Each hostel resident should bring one lock (with three keys), dustbin and a bucket with a mug for his/her personal use. These items will not be provided by the University.
11. Hostel residents are not permitted to inter-change their rooms without the permission of the Hostel Administration. The decision to allot rooms will be prerogative of the administration.
12. Each hostel resident shall enter leave details in the 'Movement Register' kept in the Hostel.
13. Hostel residents shall show their Identity Card if so, required by any officer of the University at any time.
14. All the hostellers must take permission for leaving the hostel through ERP only and before leaving the campus, the hosteller must get endorsed the out time at Security Gate otherwise the hosteller will be liable for disciplinary action as per the rules of the University. On working days, no permission to leave the hostel will be granted unless the student has obtained written permission from the parent/local guardian. Movement register is mandatory for leaving the hostel. If student is absent during attendance time parents/local guardian will be informed by warden on same day. If a student is not reporting consistently for 3 days, then the matter shall be reported by the respective warden to the hostel committee/concerned HOD/Dean.
15. If any hostel resident provides false information about his/her night stay out of the hostel, it will be considered as an act of indiscipline and will warrant penal action.
16. Hostel residents are permitted to watch TV located in the Common Room of the hostel till 10.00 P.M.
17. All hostel residents are expected to be in their rooms by the time fixed by Chief Warden/Hostel Warden. Those who are found out of room after the specified time will be marked absent. In case, a room-mate is found absent after 10.00 P.M. without leave or prior intimation, the other room-mate shall report the matter immediately to the Hostel Warden/Chief Warden/some senior staff in the campus. If any student is found absent from the room during a surprise check at night, the room-mate will be considered to be in collusion with the absentee and will also be held responsible for not reporting the matter.
18. Ragging and/or harassment of any kind to other students is strictly prohibited. Necessary disciplinary action shall be taken against the offenders as per the Hon'ble Supreme Court's guidelines on ragging.
19. Possession or consumption of drugs/alcoholic drinks/tobacco in any form/any other intoxicant or possession of any kind of ammunition/weapon of assault/fire-arm is strictly prohibited in the hostel and University campus. Those, who are found to be involved in such activities, will be expelled from the hostel and the matter will be further reported to the district administration/police.
20. Association of any hostel resident with any unlawful organization or indulging in any anti-national /social activities are strictly prohibited. If a hostel resident is found/reported to be involved in such activities by the University, the concerned hostel resident will be expelled from the hostel.
21. Use of electrical appliance of any kind is not permitted, except the room Air Conditioner during the summer months (April to September). Lights & fans should be switched off and water taps to be shut off when not in use. If electrical appliances other than AC and ceiling fan are found, it will be confiscated, fine will be levied besides initiation of disciplinary action and such appliances will be returned after course completion only.
22. Consumption of 100 units per month/per student for air-conditioned rooms is free, subject to modification by competent authority from time to time. The charges exceeding the permissible limit will be shared by the occupants on pro-rata basis and charged monthly.

23. Misuse of mobile phones in any manner including MMS, activities amounting to cybercrime and viewing of questionable websites in the campus is strictly prohibited. Students are not permitted to make audio/video recordings of hostel or mess premises or upload the same on the Internet. Students are expected to be vigilant and avoid posting derogatory or insulting comments in social media platforms.
24. Washing & drying of the clothes is not permitted except in the dedicated washing and drying area in each hostel.
25. Hanging of clothes in the balcony is not permitted.
26. Hostel residents are advised not to keep valuables with them in the room. Such items, if any, should be locked in their respective cupboards or any other safe place for safekeeping. The university shall bear no responsibility for the loss of such personal belongings.
27. Each hostel resident shall be responsible for the furniture and the electrical fittings provided in his/her room. He/she should get his/her room checked for furniture, fittings & fixtures etc. at the time of allotment and hand over the charge of the same along with the room key while vacating the room to the Warden.
28. In case of damage to any building, furniture or other university property, the cost of repair and/or replacement along with the appropriate penalty will be levied on those found to be immediately responsible. But, if the individual(s) causing the damage is unidentifiable, the cost of repair and penalty charge shall be recovered from all the residents of the hostel/block/room on a pro-rata basis.
29. While vacating the room, the resident must ensure that bills of all services availed by him/her are duly paid for speedy settlement of caution money. Submission of 'No Dues Certificate' on the prescribed form is essential.
30. University reserves the right to break/open any room which is not vacated, pack up the belongings and store it. No complaints of breakage or loss will be entertained. University can also break open the rooms in case of any violation of hostel rules, suspected unlawful activities or on the basis of security risk perceived.
31. Hostellers will not be allowed to keep their vehicles in the campus (except PG Students of Medical and Dental in designated parking area).
32. Hostel residents are required to divulge information if they have any medical problem(s) or are allergic to any medicine, immediately.
33. If any hostel resident(s) is suffering from a communicable disease or any other disease which requires constant medical attention, he/she shall vacate the hostel unconditionally and immediately on knowing the disease/ailment.
34. In case of any emergency/hospitalization, the University will contact the parents/local guardian of the hostel resident to inform them of the situation and take their advice. In the scenario where, due to any reason, the parent/local guardian could not be contacted, then the decision(s) made by the University will be final and acceptable by the parents/local guardian. All expenses incurred for the resident's treatment will be borne by the parents/local guardian.
35. DSW will, appoint one or more student as "Prefect(s)" on the basis of academic merit out of top five students to coordinate between the Warden and the residents.
36. Hostel residents are permitted to entertain their guest(s)/local guardian/parents in the Visitor's Room of the hostel only as per following visiting schedule:
 

<b>Weekdays</b>	: 05.00 P.M. to 07.00 P.M.	
<b>Sundays/Holidays</b>	: 10.00 A.M. to 07.00 P.M.	

However, in exceptional circumstances, parents may be allowed to visit their wards out of visiting hours with the prior permission of the Warden.
37. No other individual(s) other than the hostel residents and university staff are allowed to enter the hostel premises.
38. Parents/local guardians/guests are not permitted to stay overnight in the hostel.
39. The hostel residents are required to take their meal(s) in the mess only. The timings of meals shall be strictly observed. At present, the timings are as follows:

40. Hostel Residents are not allowed to take out meals and any utensils/crockery from the Mess. If Mess utensils/crockery are found in rooms then he/she will be penalized. However, in case of illness, this may be allowed with the permission of the hostel warden.
41. The hostel residents must be dressed properly while going to the mess.
42. The food in mess will be served in buffet style. Wastage in any form should be avoided.
43. Defaulting hostel residents shall be liable to fines/penalties for violation of rules as prescribed by the University.
44. An appeal against fines/penalties/other actions shall lie with the Vice-Chancellor who will have full authority to reject the appeal or reduce, enhance, or modify the action taken by the competent authority.
45. The hostel rules are subject to change from time to time with the approval of the competent authority.
46. If the hostel resident is not feeling well, he/she should seek medical help at the appropriate time. However, in case of emergency necessary help will be provided by the University on the request of the hostel resident to reach the hospital.
47. Students may also be asked to shift to alternate accommodation at short notice due to administrative reasons. Students shall be required to make their rooms available for inspection, repairs, maintenance or disinfection, whenever required and shall vacate the rooms when leaving for the vacations/holidays. Students should vacate the rooms only on working days and during the office hours.
48. Once a student vacates the hostel at his/her own request, he/she will not be re-allotted hostel accommodation for a minimum period of six months. Residents who wish to vacate the hostel are to meet the warden to start the formalities. Permission of the parents is mandatory for vacating the hostel.
49. Pets of all kinds are prohibited inside the hostel. Feeding stray dogs or cats in the hostel premises is not permitted.
50. Fire Hazards and Safety: Candles and incense are a fire hazard and are not permitted in the hostels. Combustible materials such as gasoline, paint thinner and oil lamps also are not permitted (as well) BURSTING CRACKERS, CARRYING CRACKERS TO THE ROOMS AND LIGHTING OF LAMPS/CANDLES ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED IN AND AROUND THE HOSTEL PREMISES AT ALL TIMES.
51. Giving the room keys to any person other than the Block Supervisors/ Caretakers/ Wardens, in good faith is at their own risk.
52. Students shall not write or display slogans, posters, flags in his/her room or anywhere in the premises.
53. The university authorities will not be responsible for any self-harm actions by any student.
54. Personal belongings of the students proceeding on vacation may be left behind in the hostel till they return. All such articles must be packed, properly labelled, and entrusted to the hostel cloak-room for safe custody. Students are advised not to leave behind any costly items in the hostels when they go on vacation. The university reserves all rights to allocate the room for another academic activity or undertake repairs/maintenance work during holidays/vacations.

55. The rooms allotted to students will be changed every year after summer vacation. He/she may be allotted room in same or another hostel. The decision of the university will be final and binding in this regard.
56. Playing loud music or disturbing fellow hostel inmates will not be permitted. Use earphones while listening to music. Playing outdoor games inside the hostels/corridors is not permitted. Silent Hours will be observed from 10:00 p.m. to 07:00 a.m. on all days. No sort of noise will be permitted during the Silent Hours. Serious action will be taken on the breach of this rule as per university rules.
57. The gate closing time for both Girl's and Boys' Hostel is 09:30 PM.
58. The gate pass automatically stands cancelled once the student has entered the hostel premises.
59. Wardens are authorized to issue gate passes exclusively for declared vacations and off days. If a hostel resident requires a gate pass during the academic term, he/she must obtain approval from the respective Dean and hostel warden.
60. No furniture should be shifted from one room to another without prior written permission of hostel administration.
61. Residents should inform to the Hostel office for any change in address, email address, Mobile phone number and Telephone Nos. of local guardian and parents, immediately.
62. Detailed rules and regulations are to be signed separately by the student and their parents at the time of Hostel Admission.

### PREVENTION OF RAGGING

1. Ragging is a punishable offence under the guidelines issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
2. The following will be considered as acts of ragging:
  - a. To physically assault, threaten, and/or use of physical force.
  - b. To violate the status, dignity, and honour of a student.
  - c. To expose a student to ridicule and contempt/affect his or her self-esteem.
  - d. To entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures, and obscene behaviour.
  - e. To compel newcomers to indulge in activities related to dangerous stunts.
  - f. To force junior or new students to parade and stage entertainment.
  - g. To impose a heavy financial burden by way of forced celebrations and hosting.
  - h. To create rowdy celebrations through forcible acts, thus compelling the juniors to participate.
  - i. To press the newcomers for a noisy, disorderly scene.
  - j. To tease, play rough jokes, and engage in rough play against companions, especially the new students.
  - k. To be noisy and riotous, thus disturbing the peace and tranquillity of the campus.

All students are advised to refrain from engaging in any sort of ragging activity. Any student found involved in any sort of ragging activities in the campus, bus, or hostel shall invite disciplinary action as per the ruling of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and guidelines issued by UGC, MCI, State High Court, and District Court. Such a student may even be expelled from the university.

### PREVENTION OF SEXUAL HARASSMENT & EVE TEASING

The University has a 'Zero tolerance' policy for any act of sexual harassment. A standing committee for the prevention of sexual harassment and eve-teasing has been constituted to look into any complaint in this regard.

#### Internal Complaints Committee on Sexual Harassment and Eve Teasing

In compliance with the "The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act, 2013," SGT University has constituted an Internal Complaints Committee on Sexual Harassment and Eve Teasing as per the provisions of this act for the effective enforcement of the basic human right of gender equality and guarantee against sexual harassment and abuse, more particularly against sexual harassment at work.

#### Objectives of the Committee

1. To prevent discrimination and sexual harassment against women by promoting gender equality among students and employees.
2. To make recommendations to the university authorities for changes or elaborations in the Rules and Regulations for the students and the staff to make them Gender-just and to lay down procedures for the prohibition, resolution, settlement, and prosecution of acts of discrimination and sexual harassment against women by the students and employees.
3. To deal with the cases of discrimination and sexual harassment against women in a time-bound manner, aiming at ensuring support services to the victimised and the termination of the harasser.
4. To recommend appropriate punitive action against the guilty party by the university authorities.

#### Procedure for Approaching the Committee

An aggrieved woman shall make, in writing, a complaint to the Internal Complaints Committee within a period of three months from the date of the incident and, in case of a series of incidents, within a period of three months from the date of the last incident. The written complaint may be addressed by the victim or a third party to the Chairperson of the Internal Complaints Committee. The complaint can also be made online, for which a link has been provided on the university website (<https://sgtuniversity.ac.in/form-raising-grievance-complaint/>). If the complaint is made to the Head of the Department/Dean of the Faculty, or any committee member or any other officer of the university, the same shall be forwarded to the Chairperson of the committee through the Office of the Registrar. The Committee shall deal with all the complaints of sexual harassment relating to students, staff and faculty studying/working at the SGT University in consonance with the provisions of the POSH Act, 2013.

The following acts shall be deemed "unwelcome" sexually determined behaviour and are considered as punishable offenses under Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita:

1. Physical contact and advances.
2. Demand or request for sexual favours.
3. Sexually coloured remarks.
4. Showing pornography.
5. Other unwelcome physical, verbal, or non-verbal conduct of a sexual nature.
6. Eve-teasing.
7. Unsavoury remarks.
8. Jokes which are likely to cause awkwardness or embarrassment.
9. Gender-based innuendos and taunts.
10. Gender-based insults or sexist remarks.
11. Unwelcome sexual overtone in any manner, such as over the telephone (obnoxious telephone calls) and the like.
12. Touching or brushing against any part of the body, and the like.
13. Displaying pornographic or other offensive or derogatory pictures, cartoons, pamphlets, or sayings.
14. Forcible physical touch or molestation.
15. Physical confinement against one's will and any other act likely to violate one's privacy.
